#5 **Red** represents being responsible for what

I say and do. A Girl Scout readily admits her strengths and weaknesses and is aware of the consequences of her actions.

#6 **Yellow** represents respect for myself and others.

A Girl Scout acts with integrity. She directs her thoughts and deeds to encompass her own beliefs and to be sensitive to those around her.

A Girl Scout respects authority.
